- Securing approval for all product selections and any needed product driven ROS's.
- With input from our Production Manager (PM), order all finishes/cabinetry/fixtures on an as needed basis.
- Work within Penn systems; operational, philosophical, and financial to ensure a fantastic client experience and produce desired net profit goals.
- As needed, accompany our clients to area showrooms to guide and support their selection process.
- Build the necessary relationships with area showrooms to ensure a pleasant, productive visit for you & our clients.
- For items that Penn will source in-house, ensure that Penn has what it needs (samples/displays) in its office to support/secure product decisions.
- Attend in-house preconstruction meetings to ensure our production team gets their questions answered and understands all product.
